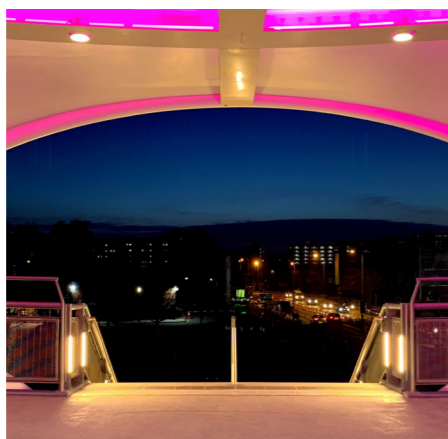


Direct flights to Europe

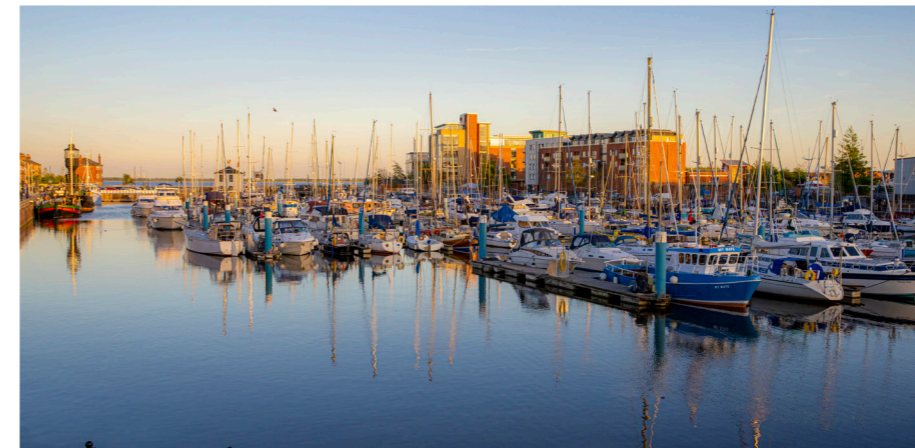

City highlights

Hull is a bustling city in Yorkshire that sits on the northern shore of the Humber Estuary. The city is a stones throw away from some of the UK's most picturesque countryside as well as expansive coastlines, offering students the best of both worlds.

The entire city centre has been totally revamped in recent years with the addition of brilliant lighting and unique fountains in Queen Victoria Square. The old Marina and Fruit Market have been transformed, turning warehouses into the new heart and soul of the city where you can find busy art galleries, bars, restaurants and lively music venues.



Hull Marina

is a peaceful oasis amidst the bustle of the Humber Estuary. With a history that spans over 200 years, the Marina moors up to 260 boats at any one time.

Hull offers students a wide variety of cultural attractions including a Museum Quarter, Ferens Art Gallery, a Grade II listed park and the deepest Aquarium in Europe.

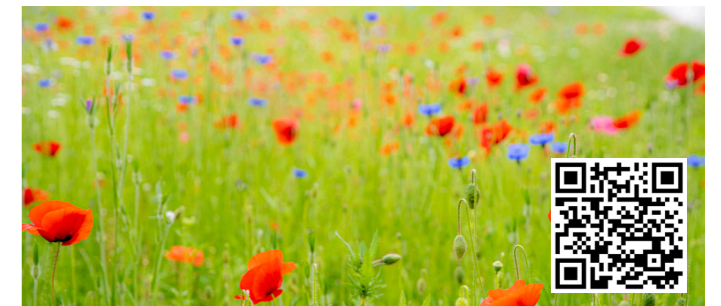

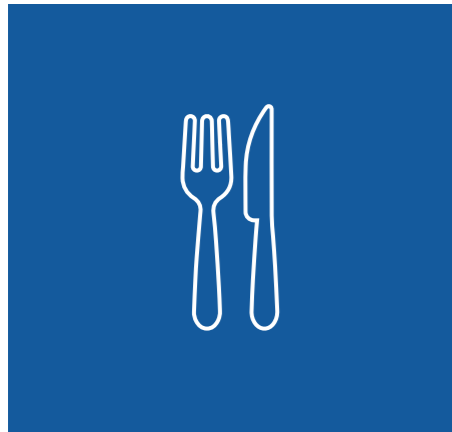

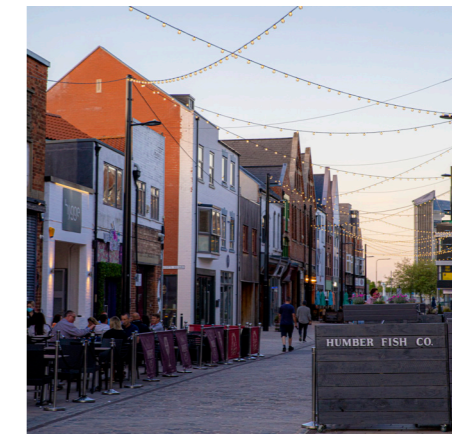
The Fruit Market

Walk the Humber Bridge

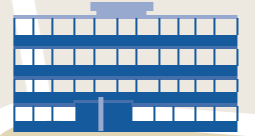

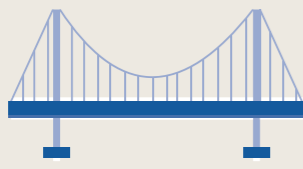

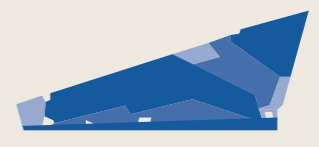
