Preston is a small city with a big personality. The vibrant and proud city is home to **ON**CAMPUS progression partner the University of Central Lancashire (UCLan), one of the UK's largest universities. The city's close proximity to hubs such as Manchester, Liverpool, Leeds and Sheffield means there are lot of things to do as a student and its location also helps increase the employment prospects of UCLan graduates. Students wishing to travel during their time in the UK are well catered for in Preston.

Sitting on the West Coast mainline, there are frequent and fast trains to London, Edinburgh and Glasgow as well as regular and direct services to 12 of the UK's largest cities, including Manchester, Liverpool and Birmingham.

Preston is also a major hub for the UK road network, with three motorways originating from the city going to destinations throughout the country. People without a car also have a comprehensive and complete local and national bus service operating from Europe's second largest bus station.

Airports:

Manchester Airport is the closest international airport to UCLan. Manchester International Airport (40 miles) offers non-stop scheduled flights to destinations throughout Europe, South Asia and The Far East, North America, Africa, and the Middle East.



Pizza Express


